

## Latest Updates from BCS

## **RBP** inoculum inhibition procedure

Following publication of the Research Hub report titled "Evaluation of the potential for improvement of the Residual Biogas Potential test and investigation of alternative test procedures for 'End of Waste' biofertilisers", the BCS team reviewed the findings and can now confirm that the inoculum inhibition procedure (<u>found here</u>) will be maintained for the foreseeable future, as no longer a short- or medium-term solution for RBP testing in the event of inoculum inhibition issues.

As part of the Hub project, the use of site inoculum for RBP testing was rigorously evaluated against alternative methodologies. The project confirmed that this approach remains the most reliable and robust method for ensuring accurate and consistent results in the RBP test. Its effectiveness in mitigating inhibition risks and providing dependable assessments of digestate stability was clearly demonstrated.

This decision underscores the scheme's commitment to evidence-based methodologies that align with industry needs and environmental objectives, ensuring that biofertiliser Operators' can continue to rely on a consistent and scientifically validated approach.
